## Summer Teaching Institute

The Summer Teaching Institute at Washington Adventist University (WAU) offers certification preparation courses for teachers seeking certification or continuing education credits for certified teachers.

The program is designed to provide quality curricula for teachers from diverse backgrounds and meets re-quirements for certification with the North American Division of Seventh-day Adventists and the Maryland State Department of Education.
The summer sessions are organized to provide choices in meeting personal and professional needs. Classes are offered online in three sessions. During Session 1, students work independently throughout the summer to complete an academic-rich portfolio. Classes held during Sessions II and III are completed in two weeks by means of intensive online instruction.
